
## Shrimp Boat "Princess Johana"

Ted Bennett February 4, 2010 Colorful "Old Key West" is often found on Stock Island, the first key east on US 1.




Go down a narrow walkway at the end of a rugged, pot-holed street named Front and find yourself on the Fishbusterz fishing dock.

The remainder of the Key West shrimp boat fleet ties up in this harbor. The shrimp boat "Princess Johana" lies amid the sea's detritus.








Second glance, too.
